In the past fiscal staff engaged in a number of conferences to EAL teachers and settlement workers to let them know about English Online Inc.; these included: TEAL Manitoba SAG, Westman Immigrant Centre Regional Coordinators and EAL Teacher, Manitoba Best Practices Conference (Jamieson presented with a panel of Literacy experts and Gniadek presented with Manola Barlow on *Empowering Self-Directed Learners*).

Iwona has been the Lead of Learner Services for English Online Inc. since May 2009 and is working on developing, implementing and supporting an online learner support system for self-directed learners. It is a huge undertaking but she enjoys feeling a part of a new, exciting and different initiative to support adult EAL learners in Manitoba.

Before coming to English Online Inc. she taught EAL for the Portage Learning and Literacy Centre in Portage La Prairie. She also has international teaching experience in Poland and the United Kingdom (UK). In the UK, she gained experience in facilitating Computer Assisted Language Learning (CALL) in a blended model of delivery and support (i.e. face-to-face and online).

She holds an M.A. in Teaching English as a Foreign/Second Language from the University of Warsaw and is currently involved in instructional design projects in the EAL field.

Online Learning Platform (OLP)

An important milestone in building a learning organization is the tool that supports our delivery model. As an online model of learning, English Online Inc. has as its metaphorical 'bricks and mortar', the Online Learning Platform which was built for online delivery of language resources in Manitoba. The build for the Online Learning Platform was customized for the needs of Service Providers. Through the collaboration with the Manitoba Nurse's Union and the University of Winnipeg additional functionalities were identified to support learners across the province. User Guides were developed for clients to improve their success with both online learning and self-directed learning. Orientation sessions and technical support were delivered to the Manitoba Nurses Union, the University of Winnipeg and the Diversity and Intercultural Trainers.

Dear Learners, Board Members, Funders, and Colleagues:

It has been an extraordinary year of building English Online Inc. On July 20, 2009 the first phase of the Online Learning Platform (OLP) was completed. We started registering English Online Inc. learners into this customized tool with 66 people registering before the end of the month and by the end of the year 259 registered learners with 12,462 hours in the OLP!

I am proud of all of the learning that took place over the year. Our learners gained access to a centralized location for access to more language modules, extension activities and a community of learners in a moderated discussion board. English Online Inc. hired for learners the experienced and knowledgeable support of our Lead of Learner Services, Iwona Gniadek. The addition of Pei-Jean Toews furthered our learners' engagement with English Online Inc. because of her knowledge of graphic design to communicate a message without words.

English Online Inc. also learned a lot organizationally about the support of self-directed learners, and the need for processes to ease learner integration into a self-directed online learning experience. We worked hard to 'read the book' on systems, theory and research on online learning to build a learner support model.

As service provider organizations learnt more about the people of English Online Inc. and our service model we made fantastic headway with functionality enhancements for the learner OLP tool. Further, as word spread beyond the perimeter about English Online we made inroads into regional Manitoba. These are both areas that I look forward to growing and strengthening this fiscal.

Building English Online Inc. was accomplished through the support of our volunteer board members who bring a depth of knowledge and patience to growing our service to the newcomer population. Through our Funder's confidence in our service model, we continue to serve the language learning needs of immigrants to Manitoba.







Functions of Learner Support



Learners

English Online Inc. opened registration for new clients in July 2009 in the Online Learning Platform. Through the mapping of multiple operations processes, English Online Inc. now has a learner support model which has at its centre – the learner. The design of the learner support model recognizes that facilitation of learning happens with each organizational decision made before a client even contacts English Online Inc. The learner support model moves them through initial inquiry, registration, needs assessment, module orientation and content usage. An emphasis on delivering a self-directed delivery model which allows our adult learners control over their learning now incorporates facilitated methods including support by e-mail, telephone and Skype.

Interesting Learner Statistics

- As of March 31, 2010, English Online Inc. had registered 259 learners, capturing 2% of newcomers arriving in the province in 2009 (N=13,518)¹.
- Our regional registration was 8% of our total registrants, which does not yet reflect the settlement of 30% of newcomers who settle outside of Winnipeg¹.
- 41% of our learners fall into the 35-44 age which is higher than the median age of newcomers who are 27 years old.²
- Over one quarter of our learners speak a language that is not shared by two or more registered learners; another quarter of our learners have Tagalog as their first language.
- 87 % of our learners have landed less than 5 years ago.
- 63% of our learners are working.
